

GENERAL ORDER NO. 63

RESPONSE TO THE TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF THE CORNELL SAN FRANCISCO RESIDENTIAL REENTRY CENTER ("RRC") LOCATED AT 111 TAYLOR STREET, SAN FRANCISCO, CA, AS A RESULT OF A BUILDING FIRE ON JUNE 17TH, 2010.


In response to the fire which occurred on June 17, 2010, at the San Francisco Cornell Residential Reentry Center, the Court orders that, in lieu of placement in the Residential Reentry Center, the offender shall be placed into the U.S. Probation Office location monitoring program as directed by the probation officer, for a period to be determined by the probation officer which will not exceed the previously ordered term of residential reentry center placement. The form of location monitoring technology shall be determined by the probation officer. Unless otherwise instructed, the offender will be directed to return to the Residential Reentry Center when space becomes available.

Alternatively, the offender may be released to a residential treatment program for up to 90 days, a homeless shelter, or other form of housing as directed by the probation officer.

This general order sunsets on July 30th, 2010, or unless otherwise ordered by the Court.
