

INTERIM STANDING ORDER REGARDING GOVERNMENT SHUTDOWN

As all are aware, the country is currently in a government shut down. Effective Monday, October 20, 2025, the judiciary will run out of funding. As a consequence, the Clerk's Office's operations will be limited. During this time, the Court will continue operations as usual to the extent possible.

Considering the impact of the shutdown on the courts, the Court asks that all parties with upcoming court appearances meet and confer at their earliest convenience to consider whether scheduled matters might be continued for a brief period of time or vacated if doing so would not adversely affect the interests of the parties. The Court also asks that parties meet and confer prior to filing any anticipated substantive motion to discuss whether the Court's urgent resolution of the issue is necessary at this time.

We look forward to continuing to uphold the rule of law and fulfill our duties under the Constitution, and we appreciate all parties' consideration and patience.
